How Much Training Will I Need?

At Gadsden City High School, cosmetology is a four semester program. After completion of all basic theory and performance tasks, you are eligible for State Board Examinations. After passing this exam you will receive your cosmetology license. Students who do not complete the full four semester program will need to complete additional training after high school.
